K1

Learners appreciate that technology helps with learning at school and in the wider world.

Year 2

Learners identify ways in which technology supports collaboration, learning, and productivity in school and in the wider world.

Learners demonstrate an understanding of age appropriate issues related to safe, healthy, and acceptable use of digital devices (e.g., online safety and privacy, amount of daily screen use, safe searching, online etiquette) and describe personal consequences of inappropriate use.

Year 4

Learners identify ways in which technology supports collaboration, learning, and productivity in society and recognise some limitations.

Learners select and apply technology resources and describe how these tools improve their ability to communicate, collaborate, be productive, and achieve goals.

Year 6

Learners reflect on, analyses and evaluates the use of learning technologies and its broad impact on lifestyles, commerce, environmental and human progress.

Learners describe how they select and use technology resources to pursue their personal and academic learning projects outside of the classroom.

Year 2

Year 4

Year 6

Learners model attributes of a good digital citizen who demonstrates that they are responsible and respectful in the online world and take action to create a safe and comfortable environment.
